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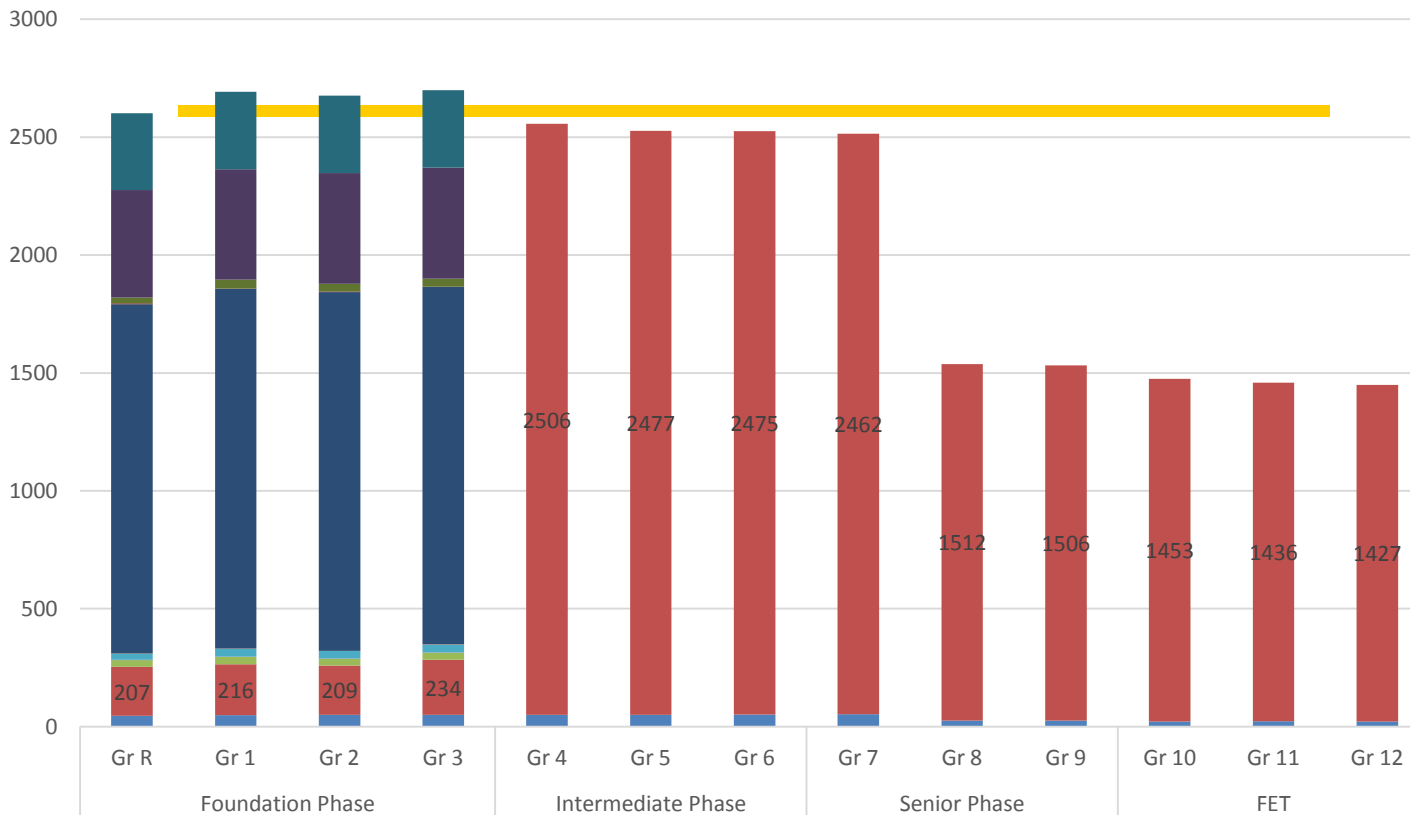

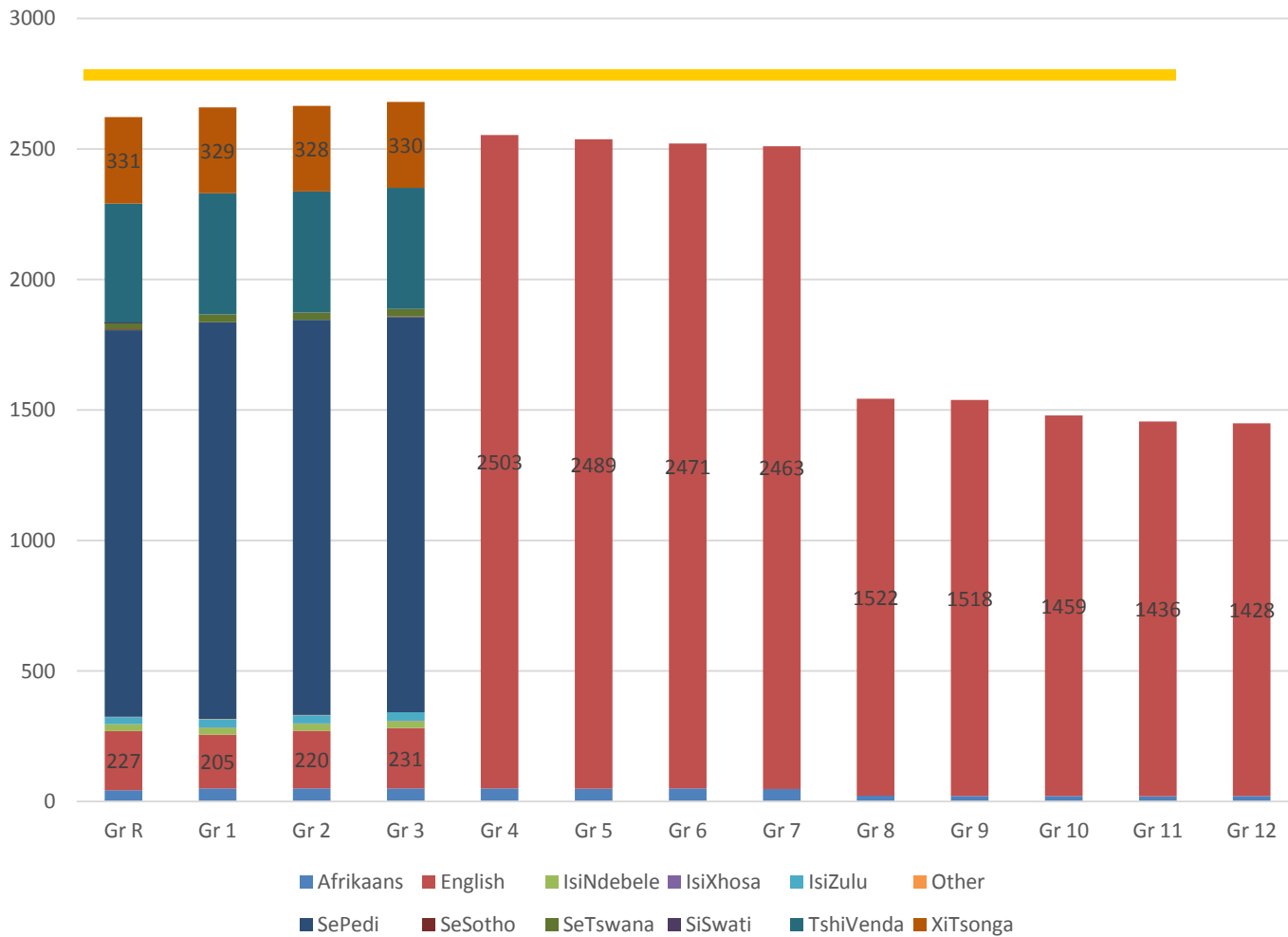
Limpopo LoLT Per Grade - 2015

- # Ordinary Schools per LoLT, Grade and Phase
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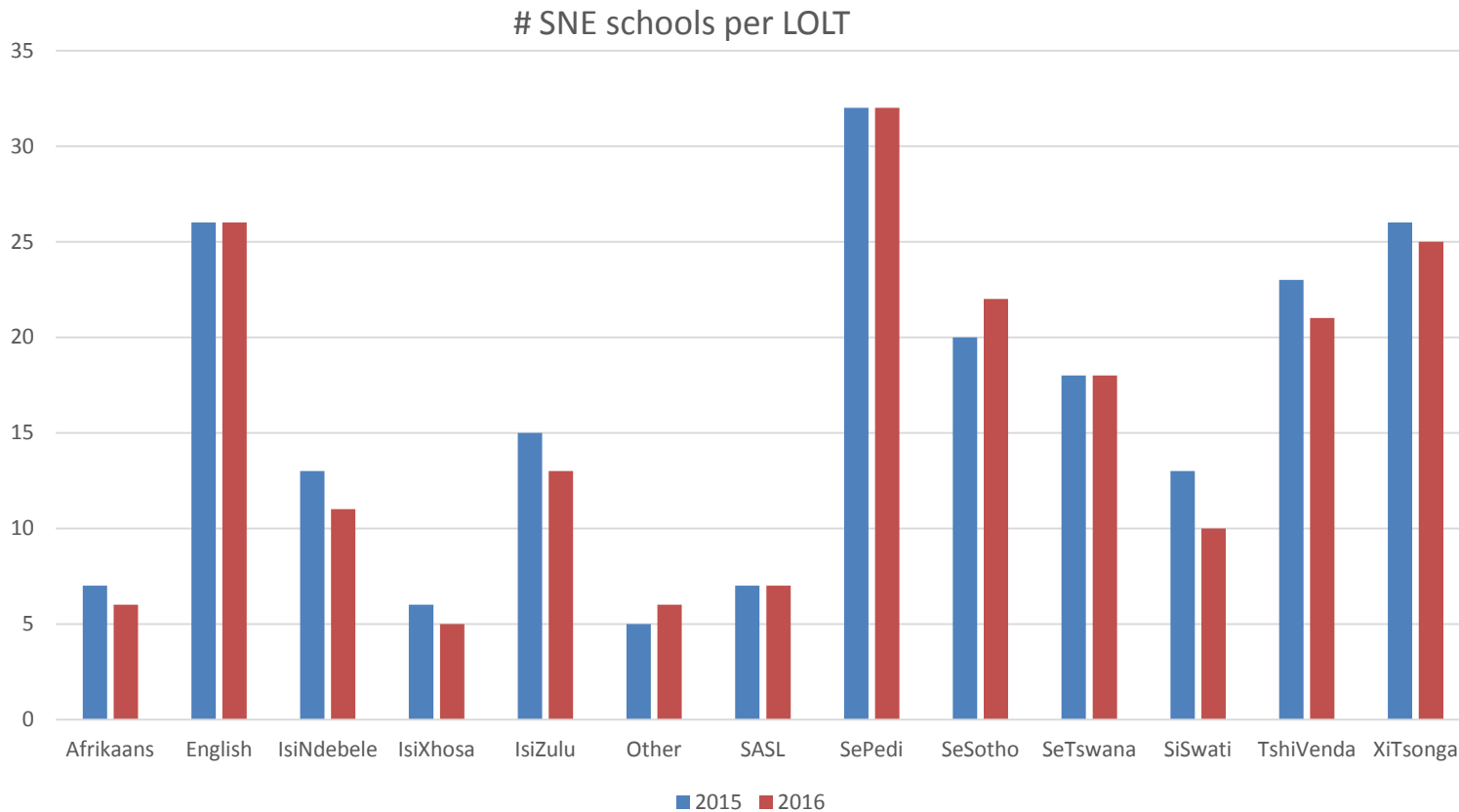


Limpopo LoLT Per Grade 2016
